UPPER - Satisfied: (1's of Col. 16 - run on Col. 17)

1. Doing best can, a big job, a good job, sincere
2. Considering opposition, Russian veto, lack of ammunition, etc. - a good job
3. Prevented a war so far - working for peace
4. Bringing Russia about - control of Russia
5. Slow, but good; keep it working - takes time
6. Marshall plan, helping Europe with food, etc.
- V. Miscellaneous: - gave Palestine recognition, The Atlantic pact, except for China, things settling down; All countries receive protection, etc.

LOWER - Dissatisfied (2's of Col. 16 - run on Col. 18)

1. No progress; hoped for more from it; nothing accomplished; side track issues - too slow.
2. No ammunition for their guns; no teeth; all talk no action; cannot back up their decisions.
3. Russia - too easy with her - letting communism spread thru Europe
4. Nations motives not for unity - distrust, quibbling, lack of cooperation.
5. Failed in China, Palestine.
6. World too unsettled, danger of war.
